It also considers some of the consequences of such innovations for established forms of social and political analysis. The third section explores some of the transversal topics of research that have been pursued within IPS, including inequality, migration, citizenship, the effect of technology on practices of security, the role of experts and expertise, data-driven surveillance, and the relation between mobility, power and inequality.
